### **The Trees come down on Madison Street**

The excitement and the anticipation is starting to mount! Things are beginning to happen with Habitat for Humanity's Madison Street Project. The trees on the property have been taken down, making space for our duplex homes to be built. The home plans have been prepared and are on display in the Habitat Office at 2 East Church Street in Frederick City. The next step is to have the positioning of the house outlined and surveyed, and then we will be pulling permits for the homes to be built. Concrete will need to be poured and cured...then the sound of hammers to nails, saws, generators; the sound of construction. At this time we are still waiting on a couple grants to come in and we are hopeful for a late summer start date.

Our homeowners, Marialva deMatos and her two daughters, have been waiting patiently for over two years for their home to start. Marialva's family is sponsored by All Saints Episcopal Church, partnered with the F.S.K. Lions Club and Randall Charitable Trust. New to our Women Build side of the build is Homeowner Deborah Gilbert, a victim of Hurricane Katrina who is sponsored by our Habitat Women Build program; Citi is our Major Sponsor for the Women Build project along with Women's Giving Circle, Lowes, and JP Morgan Chase.
