LCIF

Lions collected \$59.50 at our two meetings in November, and nothing in December. For the fiscal year, we've now collected an official total of \$369.50. However,

two Lions donated \$1,050 online earlier in the year, and one Lion sent a check for \$50 to LCIF from a direct mail appeal in December. That total is being kept as a separate record until we can confirm we got credit. Last fiscal year, we collected nearly \$700 at our meetings and a couple of other channels. Our goal for '24-'25 is \$1,000 at our meetings, so we're lagging a bit behind.

Lion Gary read the following brief article about LCIF in action at our second November meeting.

Expanding a Children's Hospital in New Zealand

Wellington Regional Children's Hospital is New Zealand's first children's hospital and is one of only five hospitals in the country that perform specialized pediatric surgery. Recognizing the existing hospital space was overcrowded and inadequate, Lions in New Zealand utilized a \$100,000 Matching Grant from LCIF, and funding from the Lloyd Morgan Lions Charitable Trust individual donors to build an Rehabilitation Outdoor and Therapeutic Facility. The new facility provides a wide range of therapeutic, rehabilitative developmental benefits to patients, and provides a space for patients and their families to seek refuge from the stress of the hospital environment. Each year, more than 80,000 beneficiaries will benefit from the new facility.

HOLIDAY PROJECT

While only 3 Lions participated in this project, we were able to deliver to Citizens Care & Rehabilitation Center on 12/13: 2

body wash, 2 shampoo, 2 hand soap, 2 body lotion, 2 deodorant, 2 knit caps, 2 pr socks, two 20-ct pks note cards, 25 loose note cards, 1 eyeglass cleaning cloth, 70 notepads, and 11 pocket-sized notepads. (SA-06570214)

FRIENDS & FAMILY FOOD DRIVE

Lions donated 92 food items in November and a whopping 895 items in December! Most of the December total is attributed to our annual "family and friends" food drive. We filled up the back of the Bennett's SUV and delivered the haul to the Frederick Food Bank on 12/12. Our goal for '24-'25 was 500 items. We've now collected and donated 1,162 items for the fiscal year, so we've topped our goal handily. But please don't stop. Let's keep it going. MEDICAL EQUIPMENT LENDING PROGRAM

Lion Ellen Bennett

The Medical Equipment Lending Program received donations of 37 pieces of equipment in October. As of 10/31, we had 151 pieces of equipment in stock. We loaned out

64 pieces of equipment to 41 people and have referred 21 people to other clubs or organizations to assist with acquiring equipment, mostly for wheelchairs and hospital beds.

The program received donations of 62 pieces of equipment in November. As of 11/30, we had 158 pieces of equipment in stock. We loaned out 40 pieces of equipment to 32 people and have referred 24 people to other clubs or organizations to assist with acquiring equipment, mostly for wheelchairs and hospital beds. Several offers of hospital beds were referred to other Lions clubs.

The program received donations of 50 pieces of equipment in December. As of 12/31, we had 189 pieces of equipment in stock. We loaned out 34 pieces of equipment to 24 people and have referred 12 people to other clubs or organizations to assist acquiring equipment, mostly for wheelchairs and hospital beds. Several offers of hospital beds were referred to other Lions clubs. Over 75 items of medical supplies were donated to the Humanitarian Center for shipment to Ukraine in early December. Items included orthopedic boots and braces, oxygen equipment and tubing, CPAP and BiPap machines, crutches, canes, a specialized wheelchair and more.

We experienced the return of many pieces of equipment from clients this month and can report that the "warehouse" is now full! Referrals continue to come from Senior Services, orthopedic physical therapy groups, FHH Home Health Physical and Occupational therapists, Whitesell's pharmacy, therapists from independent home health agencies and by word of mouth.
